How do we prepare for the future?

What kind of future are we facing?

The world as we know it now will be hugely different, beyond our imagination and by definition, unpredictable. With the impact of artificial intelligence, the world of work is constantly evolving and the nature of work in the future is probably more likely to be self-employment, with short term contractual work creating a "gig" economy where positions are most likely temporary, with global skills and reach. Currently up to 40 % of the world's workforce is self-employed. Careers that exist today may not exist by the time today's students enter the workforce, so in order to prepare for the future workplace, where the only constant is change, visionary, out of the box thinking is required. Our learners need to be adaptable so whatever the future brings they will be able to embrace it happily, with excitement and with the skills to be successful.

What are the skills that our school leavers need, not just to survive, but to be successful in this future world?

They will need to be flexible, have social mobility, show initiative and be self-motivated. Education may not be confined to school or university but will rather be a lifelong process as people explore success in different career areas. This success will require a focus on strategic, empathetic, critical and design thinking and the ability to be distinguished from work that is done by artificial intelligence.

They will learn how become innovative and creative in everything that they do.

All curricular learning is "contextual" so that real life situations are directly connected to the curriculum. It is not just about learning content.


